Program Activities Risk RED's accomplishments in 2010:

DREAMS - Initial design of the web-portal infrastructure for a multi-partner **Disaster Reduction Education Learning Management System** (see p2).

DREAMS for Turkey - School Disaster Management policy, handbook and online self-study curriculum with the Ministry of Education in Turkey, with support from American Red Cross, UNICEF and UNICEF (see p.3).

Development of comprehensive survey for education sector **participants** in the annual community-wide **ShakeOut** drills. Reports on 2009 and 2010 results will be produced in 2011.. Risk RED improved on guidance materials to support school participation. Conducted survey research to reveal lessons about school preparedness and resilience in California, with global significance. **School Disaster Management and ShakeOut Study Tour** for Turkish and Central Asian participants (see p.4).


Disaster and Emergency Management Guidance for Schools handbook and **Guide for K-12 Teachers** developed for the International
Finance Corporation (World Bank) for target audience of private schools internationally.

Public awareness and public education for disaster risk reduction: a guide developed for the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. Operational guidance, resources and annexes was developed based on a scoping study of current practices in the RC/RC Movement internationally. International references for standardized messaging were also compiled and analyzed.

Disaster Risk Reduction Tools for Humanitarian Action and Development in the Education Sector - researched and developed for IASC Education in Emergencies Cluster and UNICEE.

Other activities include webmaster for the social networking website of the **Coalition for Global School Safety and Disaster Prevention Education**, presentations, and publications related to program and policy guidance especially for school disaster management, public education and community-based disaster risk reduction.

Strategies for a shared 'learning object repository' and collaborative authoring enabling automated publishing in many environments is the second major goal of the project.

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

SCHOOL DISASTER AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT POLICY

Risk RED is working with the Republic of Turkey Ministry of Education (MoNE) to support introduction of school disaster management nationwide.

This year, 12 instructor-trainers provided an introduction to school disaster management to more than 4,000 elementary and secondary school teachers throughout Turkey.

Content developed for a policy handbook on School Disaster and Emergency Management were approved by the Ministry's Education Cultivation Directorate.

COURSEWARE DEVELOPMENT

Dreams online self-study courseware in development aims to be visually-appealing and to engaging for users.

This year, we worked on graphic organizers and illustrator Hasret Sayın developed character and scenes to introduce and support school disaster management online course content.

Risk RED joined Earthquake Country Alliance (ECA) in California again to support the second annual California-wide ShakeOut in October 2010.

Risk RED Board Member Mark Benthien at Earthquake Country Alliance, has continued to encourage our efforts in the education sector, international outreach and research and evaluation of preparedness and ShakeOut impacts.

Dr. Rebekah Green of Western Washington University, and Dr. Marla Petal teamed up again with Dr. Michelle Wood of Cal. State Univ. Fullerton, to fully synchronized education sector and organizational and individual and family preparedness surveys.

This year our team led an American Red Crosssupported study group from Turkey and Central Asia looking at both school safety and community-wide drills.

Risk RED supported ECA and American Red Cross efforts to tackle viral disinformation about what to do during the shaking. The Model Drill and Templates developed based on the Los Angeles Unified School District's model were once again used by many smaller school districts.

Risk RED hopes to support the development of an international community-of-practice for disaster resilient universities by promoting campus-wide drills as a microcosm and model for communitywide drills in the future.
