- -should barangay (village) and other community leaders

be included?

- 2. Training Workshop Title (better to have safety in the title than emergency preparedness and disaster risk reduction)
- -Training Workshop on Building Safe Learning Environment
- -Training Workshop on School Community Safety (school as community; school- community linkage)
- 3.Duration: 3 to 4 days, inclusive of "school community watching" (participatory risk assessment in the school and immediate community)
- 4. Approach (participatory, learner-centered cutting across different pax: school authorities, teachers, students, parents)
- -learning by doing;
- -less inputs (lectures on concepts, theories)
- -more guiding the school community pax through the process of building safe learning environment
- -integrating with DepEd and Phil DM System DRR initiatives
- 5.Preparation: Bring Spot Map of School Community and if available also pictures of damages of previous disasters
- 6.Basic Content Structure (make titles appropriate for school community)
- -Understanding Disaster and Disaster Risk Management
- -Participatory Disaster Risk Assessment
- -Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Risk Reduction
- -Participatory Disaster Risk Reduction Action Planning
- 7. Understanding Disaster and Disaster Risk Management

a.Workshop1:

- What Disasters Have Been Experienced in the Past
- What were impacts (damages) on school community?
- What were school community responses? Who (people and organizations helped the school community?

Workshop Reports with different workshop groups making presentations in the form of Timeline of Disasters;

Spot map of school community with location of damages

Note: Facilitators guide the different workshop groups in the group discussion and putting the results in the different forms

- b. Brief link-up of disaster experiences to Local and National Disaster Situation and DM System -Include brief points on DepEd's DRR Set-up and Memos
- c. Basic Concepts of Disaster and Disaster Risk Management
- -Include children's participation in DRR, child and human rights based approach in education and DRR, School Safety Programs
- 8. Participatory Disaster Risk Assessment
- -Inputs on local natural and school community hazards: nature and behavior; elements at risk per hazard
- -Participatory tools which can be used Participatory Disaster Risk Assessment, especially with children
- -School Community Watching by Groups: can divide pax to do watching by sections of the school community or all groups do the school community watching but make a route for each group so that they are not in one place at the same time
- Note 1: Ensure that there is a facilitator who can guide the pax through technical aspects of what is safe and not safe in the route of the school community watching
- Note 2: If there are digital cameras which can be used, each group can take photos of "safe" and "unsafe" practices, items
- 9. Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Risk Reduction
- -For particular hazards in the school community
- -DepED Disaster/Calamity and Fire Control Group and School Safety Initiatives
- -Hazard monitoring (example: rain gauge in the school)
- -Early warning and evacuation (signs and symbols for ready, get set, go; communication flow or protocol of warning and order to evacuate)
- -Example DRR activities involving children
- 10.Participatory Disaster Risk Reduction Action Planning
- -Focus:
- a. protecting school community (students, teachers, non-teaching personnel, community) and property (facilities, equipment, instructional materials, school records) from various hazards b. avoiding disruption of learning
- c. protecting children's rights and providing a nurturing environment for their development
- d. linking school and community in safety and development
- e. establishing coordination in DRR with higher levels of the education system and Phil DM system
